9 SEC. 902. TRAINING AND EDUCATION.

- Subject to section 907, the Secretary of Health and
- 11 Human Services, acting through the Director of the Office
- 12 on Women's Health of the Department of Health and
- 13 Human Services and in consultation with the Secretary
- 14 of Education, shall—
- 15 (1) revise and then reinstate the BodyWise
- 16 Handbook and related fact sheets and resource lists
- available on the public Internet site of the National

1	Women's Health Information Center sponsored by
2	the Office on Women's Health, to include—
3	(A) updated findings and conclusions as
4	needed; and
5	(B) thorough information about eating dis-
6	orders relating to males as well as females;
7	(2) incorporate, as appropriate, information
8	from such BodyWise Handbook and related facts
9	sheets and resource lists into the curriculum of the
10	BodyWorks obesity prevention program developed by
11	the Office on Women's Health and training modules
12	used in such obesity prevention program; and
13	(3) promote and make publicly available
14	(whether through a public Internet site or other
15	method that does not impose a fee on users) the
16	BodyWise Handbook and related fact sheets and re-
17	source lists, as updated under paragraph (1), and
18	the BodyWorks obesity prevention program, as up-
19	dated under paragraph (2), including for purposes of
20	educating universities and nonprofit entities on eat-
21	ing disorders.
22	SEC. 903. EDUCATION AND TRAINING FOR HEALTH PRO-
23	FESSIONALS.
24	(a) In General.—Subject to section 907, the Sec-
25	retary of Health and Human Services, acting through the

1	Administrator of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health
2	Services Administration, shall award grants to eligible en-
3	tities to integrate training into existing curricula for pri-
4	mary care physicians, other licensed or certified health
5	and mental health professionals, and public health profes-
6	sionals that may include—
7	(1) early intervention and identification of eat-
8	ing disorders;
9	(2) levels of treatment (including family-based
10	treatment, in-patient, residential, partial hospitaliza-
11	tion programming, intensive outpatient and out-
12	patient);
13	(3) how to properly refer patients to treatment;
14	(4) steps to aid in the prevention of the devel-
15	opment of eating disordered behaviors; and
16	(5) how to treat individuals with eating dis-
17	orders.
18	(b) Application.—An entity that desires a grant
19	under this section shall submit to the Secretary an appli-
20	cation at such time, in such manner, and containing such
21	information as the Secretary may require, including a plan
22	for the use of funds that may be awarded and an evalua-
23	tion of the training that will be provided.

1	(c) Use of Funds.—An entity that receives a grant
2	under this section shall use the funds made available
3	through such grant to—
4	(1) use a training program containing evidence-
5	based findings, promising emerging best practices,
6	or recommendations that pertain to the identifica-
7	tion, early intervention, prevention of the develop-
8	ment of eating disordered behaviors, and treatment
9	of eating disorders to conduct educational training
10	and conferences, including Internet-based courses
11	and teleconferences, on—
12	(A) how to help prevent the development of
13	eating disordered behaviors, identify, intervene
14	early, and appropriately and adequately treat
15	eating disordered patients;
16	(B) how to identify individuals with eating
17	disorders, and those who are at risk for suf-
18	fering from eating disorders and, therefore, at
19	risk for related severe medical and mental
20	health conditions;
21	(C) how to conduct a comprehensive as-
22	sessment of individual and familial health risk
23	factors; and
24	(D) how to conduct a comprehensive as-
25	sessment of a treatment plan; and

1	(2) evaluate and report to the Secretary on the
2	effectiveness of the training provided by such entity
3	in increasing knowledge and changing attitudes and
4	behaviors of trainees.
5	SEC. 904. EDUCATION AND TRAINING FOR SCHOOL AND
6	HIGHER EDUCATION PROFESSIONALS.
7	(a) Grants.—
8	(1) Authorization.—Subject to section 907,
9	the Secretary of Health and Human Services, acting
10	through the Administrator of the Substance Abuse
11	and Mental Health Services Administration, shall
12	award grants to eligible entities—
13	(A) to conduct educational seminars for
14	school personnel on eating disorders early iden-
15	tification, intervention, and prevention of behav-
16	iors that are often associated with the develop-
17	ment of eating disordered behaviors; and
18	(B) to make resources available to individ-
19	uals affected by eating disorders.
20	(2) Educational seminars.—As a condition
21	on the receipt of a grant under this subsection, an
22	eligible entity shall agree to conduct educational
23	seminars under paragraph (1)(A), taking into con-
24	sideration educational materials made available
25	through the BodyWise eating disorder initiative of

1	the Department of Health and Human Services and
2	relevant research on eating disorders.
3	(3) Eligible entity.—In this subsection, the
4	term "eligible entity" means any State, territory, or
5	possession of the United States, the District of Co-
6	lumbia, any Indian tribe or tribal organization (as

12	SEC. 905. PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS.
13	(a) In General.—Subject to section 907, the Direc-

15	duct a program of public service announcements to edu-

17	(1) the types of eating disorders;
18	(2) the seriousness of eating disorders (includ-
19	ing prevalence, comorbidities, and physical and men-
20	tal health consequences);
21	(3) how to identify, intervene, refer for treat-
22	ment, and help prevent behaviors that often lead to
23	the development of eating disordered behaviors;
24	(4) discrimination and bullying based on body
25	size;

3	(6) the signs and symptoms of eating disorders.
4	(b) Collaboration.—The Director of the National
5	Institute of Mental Health shall conduct the program
6	under subsection (a) in collaboration with—
7	(1) Centers of Excellence; and
8	(2) community-based national nonprofit re-
9	sources that support individuals affected by eating
10	disorders and work to prevent eating disorders and
11	address body image and weight issues.

17	SEC. 907. PROHIBITION ON NEW APPROPRIATIONS.
18	No additional funds are authorized to be appro-
19	priated to carry out this Act or the amendments made
20	by this title. This title and such amendments shall be car-
21	ried out using amounts otherwise made available for such
22	purposes.
