# A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Commerce to establish a jobtraining grant program for workers displaced by automation and to establish an Innovation Corps to enable recent college graduates to volunteer in job-training programs for workers displaced by automation, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- This Act may be cited as the "Innovation Corps Act 4
- of 2017".

## 1 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

2	Congress finds the following:
3	(1) The acceleration of artificial intelligence is
4	enabling the automation of jobs that have tradition-
5	ally required human labor.
6	(2) Such automation opens up new opportuni-
7	ties for individuals, the economy, and society, but
8	such automation also has the potential to disrupt the
9	employment landscape for millions of people in the
10	United States.
11	(3) The potential for artificial intelligence to
12	improve the livelihoods and quality of life for the
13	United States workforce over the long-run depends
14	on the institutions and policies in place.
15	(4) Job training for dislocated workers in the
16	skills needed in the innovation economy will be crit-
17	ical to maintaining the stability of the larger econ-
18	omy and individual families.
19	(5) Young people are often well equipped to
20	adapt to changes in technology and may be able to
21	provide unique expertise in retraining dislocated
22	workers.
23	(6) The outstanding balance of Federal student
24	loans now exceeds \$1 trillion. This debt burden is
25	limiting the ability of recent graduates to fully par-
26	ticipate in the economy.

SEC. 3. JOB-TRAINING GRANT PROGRAM FOR WORKERS

### 2 DISPLACED BY AUTOMATION. 3 (a) Establishment.—The Secretary of Commerce, in consultation with the Chief Executive Officer of the 4 5 Corporation for National and Community Service, shall establish a competitive program to make grants to institu-6 7 tions of higher education to establish or enhance education 8 programs that retrain workers displaced from their jobs 9 by automation to provide such workers with skills needed for jobs in the STEM fields. 10 11 (b) Management Plan.—Not later than 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, and not less 12 frequently than every 5 years thereafter, the Secretary 13 shall submit to the Committee on Energy and Commerce and the Committee on Appropriations of the House of 15 Representatives and the Committee 16 on Commerce, Science, and Transportation and the Committee on Appro-17 18 priations of the Senate a management plan for the grant 19 program established under this section. The plan shall include the organization, structure, and funding profiles of 20 21 the grant program for the 6 years following the submission 22 of the plan. 23 (c) Eligibility.—The Secretary may only make a 24 grant under this section to an institution of higher education that submits an application at such time, in such

form, and accompanied by such information and assur-

ances as the Secretary may require. 3 (d) Use of Funds.—An institution of higher education that receives a grant under this section shall use 5 the grant funds for one or more education programs that retrain workers displaced, or at risk of future displacement, from their jobs by automation in order to enable 8 such workers to reenter the workforce in jobs in the STEM fields. 9 10 (e) Conditions for Receipt of Grant Funds.— An institution of higher education may not receive grant 11 funds under this section unless the institution meets the 12 13 following requirements: 14 (1) The institution certifies that each education 15 program for which the institution receives grant 16 funds provides workers with training in skills needed 17 for jobs in the STEM fields. 18 (2) The institution uses graduate volunteers to 19 assist with the education program for which the in-20 stitution receives grant funds. 21 (f) Maximum Amount of Grant.—A grant under this section may not exceed \$5,000,000. 22 23 (g) Rules Prescribing Selection Criteria.— Not later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, after a public comment period of not less than

- 1 60 days, the Secretary shall issue rules prescribing the cri-
- 2 teria for selection of an institution of higher education to
- 3 receive a grant under this section. Such criteria shall in-
- 4 clude performance requirements for an education program
- 5 for which an institution of higher education receives grant
- 6 funds. The Secretary shall update such rules as necessary.
- 7 (h) Rules for Grant Administration.—Not later
- 8 than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act,
- 9 after a public comment period of not less than 60 days,
- 10 the Secretary shall issue rules to ensure that grants under
- 11 this section are made and administered in an accountable
- 12 fashion in order to prevent waste, fraud, and abuse. The
- 13 Secretary shall update such rules as necessary.
- 14 (i) DEADLINE TO BEGIN MAKING GRANTS.—The
- 15 Secretary shall begin making grants under this section not
- 16 later than 1 year after the date of the enactment of this
- 17 Act.
- 18 (j) Reports.—Not later than June 3 and December
- 19 31 of each year, the Inspector General of the Department
- 20 of Commerce and the Comptroller General of the United
- 21 States shall submit to the Committee on Energy and Com-
- 22 merce of the House of Representatives and the Committee
- 23 on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate
- 24 a report that reviews the grant program established under
- 25 this section during the 6 months preceding the submission

- 1 of the report. Such report shall include any recommenda-
- 2 tions to address waste, fraud, and abuse in such program.
- 3 (k) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
- 4 are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
- 5 \$250,000,000, of which not more than 5 percent shall be
- 6 available for the costs of administering the grant program
- 7 established under this section, for each of the fiscal years
- 8 2018 through 2028.

#### 9 SEC. 4. INNOVATION CORPS.

- 10 (a) Establishment.—Not later than 1 year after
- 11 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall
- 12 establish an Innovation Corps whereby recent college grad-
- 13 uates may volunteer, in an education program for which
- 14 an institution of higher education receives (or is eligible
- 15 to receive) a grant under section 3, to help retrain workers
- 16 that have been displaced from their jobs by automation.
- 17 (b) STIPEND.—The Secretary shall pay a monthly
- 18 stipend to each graduate volunteer in accordance with the
- 19 rules issued under subsection (c)(4).
- 20 (c) Rules.—Not later than 180 days after the date
- 21 of the enactment of this Act, after a public comment pe-
- 22 riod of not less than 60 days, the Secretary shall issue
- 23 rules containing—
- 24 (1) the eligibility requirements for graduate vol-
- 25 unteers;

1	(2) the application procedures to become a
2	graduate volunteer;
3	(3) the code of conduct for graduate volunteers;
4	and
5	(4) the amount of a monthly stipend for grad-
6	uate volunteers sufficient to furnish graduate volun-

10	(d) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
11	are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section

3	(b) Loan Forgiveness.—With respect to any bor-
4	rower of Federal student loans who completes 2 years of
5	volunteer service as a graduate volunteer in the Innovation
6	Corps established under section 4, the Secretary of Com-
7	merce shall repay, on behalf of such borrower, not more
8	than \$100,000 of the balance of principal and interest due
9	on such loans as of the date of completion of such service.
10	SEC. 6. DEFINITIONS.
11	In this Act:
12	(1) Automation.—The term "automation"
13	means the introduction of machinery into any enter-
14	prise that is intended to, or has the effect of, replac-
15	ing human labor.
16	(2) FEDERAL STUDENT LOAN.—The term
17	"Federal student loan" means a loan made under
18	part D of title IV of the Higher Education Act of
19	1965 (20 U.S.C. 1087a et seq.)
20	(3) Institution of higher education.—The
21	term "institution of higher education" has the
22	meaning given such term in section 101 of the High-
23	er Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1001).
24	(4) Graduate volunteer.—The term "grad-
25	uate volunteer" means a recent college graduate who

1	volunteers in the Innovation Corps established under
2	section 4.
3	(5) RECENT COLLEGE GRADUATE.—The term
4	"recent college graduate" means an individual who
5	has graduated from an institution of higher edu-
6	cation not more than 2 years before applying to be-
7	come a graduate volunteer in the Innovation Corp
8	established under section 4.
9	(6) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
10	the Secretary of Commerce.
11	(7) STEM FIELD.—The term "STEM field"
12	means science, technology, engineering, or mathe-
13	matics.
