(a) Medicaid Coverage.—

(1) In General.—Section 1905(a) of the So-
cial Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396d(a)) is amended
by adding at the end the following new sentence: "In
the case of a woman who is eligible for medical as-
sistance on the basis of being pregnant (including
through the end of the month in which the 60-day
period beginning on the last day of her pregnancy
ends), who is a patient in an institution for mental
diseases for purposes of receiving treatment for a
substance use disorder, and who was enrolled for
medical assistance under the State plan immediately
before becoming a patient in an institution for men-
tal diseases or who becomes eligible to enroll for
such medical assistance while such a patient, the ex-
clusion specified in the subdivision (B) following
paragraph (29) of the first sentence shall not be
construed as prohibiting Federal financial participa-
tion for medical assistance for items or services that
are provided to the woman outside of the institution
during the period of such eligibility on such basis
and through the end of the month in which the one-
year period beginning on the last day of her preg-
nancy ends to the extent such items or services
would be treated as medical assistance for such

1 woman during such period if such woman were not 2 a patient in the institution.". 3 (2) Effective date.— 4 (A) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in paragraph (2), the amendment made by sub-5 6 section (a) shall take effect with respect to 7 medical assistance provided on or after January 8 1, 2019. 9 (B) EXCEPTION IF STATE LEGISLATION 10 REQUIRED.—In the case of a State plan under 11 title XIX of the Social Security Act which the 12 Secretary of Health and Human Services deter-13 mines requires State legislation (other than leg-14 islation appropriating funds) in order for the 15 plan to meet the additional requirements im-16 posed by the amendment made by paragraph 17 (1), the State plan shall not be regarded as fail-18 ing to comply with the requirements of such 19 title solely on the basis of its failure to meet 20 these additional requirements before the first 21 day of the first calendar quarter beginning after 22 the close of the first regular session of the 23 State legislature that begins after the date of 24 the enactment of this Act. For purposes of the 25 previous sentence, in the case of a State that

1	has a 2-year legislative session, each year of
2	such session shall be deemed to be a separate
3	regular session of the State legislature.
4	(b) GUIDANCE.—Not later than one year after the
5	date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Health
6	and Human Services shall issue guidance to improve care
7	for infants with neonatal abstinence syndrome and their
8	mothers. Such guidance shall include—
9	(1) the types of services, including post-dis-
10	charge services and parenting supports, for mothers
11	and fathers of babies with neonatal abstinence syn-
12	drome that States may cover under the Medicaid
13	program under title XIX of the Social Security Act;
14	(2) best practices from States with respect to
15	innovative or evidenced-based payment models that
16	focus on prevention, screening, treatment, plans of
17	safe care, and post-discharge services for mothers
18	and fathers with substance use disorders and babies
19	with neonatal abstinence syndrome that improve
20	care and clinical outcomes;
21	(3) recommendations for States on available fi-
22	nancing options under the Medicaid program under
23	title XIX of such Act and under the Children's
24	Health Insurance Program under title XXI of such
25	Act for Children's Health Insurance Program

1	Health Services Initiative funds for home visiting
2	services for parents with substance use disorders
3	and infants with neonatal abstinence syndrome; and
4	(4) guidance and technical assistance to State
5	Medicaid agencies regarding additional flexibilities
6	and incentives related to screening, prevention, and
7	post-discharge services, including parenting sup-
8	ports, under contracts with medicaid managed care
9	organizations.
10	(c) GAO STUDY.—Not later than one year after the
11	date of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General
12	of the United States shall conduct a study ${\rm I\!\!\!\!I},$ and submit
13	to Congress a report,] addressing gaps in coverage for
14	pregnant women with substance use disorder under the
15	Medicaid program under title XIX of the Social Security
16	Act.
