1 (1) IN GENERAL.—If the Administrator of the 2 Environmental Protection Agency, in consultation 3 with the Secretary of Energy, determines that proc-4 essing or refining a critical energy resource at a crit-5 ical energy resource facility is important to the na-6 tional security or energy security of the United 7 States, then the Administrator may waive applica-8 tion of any requirement, sanction, or fee under the 9 Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7401 et seq.) that the Ad-10 ministrator, in consultation with the Governor of the 11 State in which the critical energy resource facility is 12 located, determines appropriate with respect to the 13 critical energy resource facility.

(2) CRITICAL ENERGY RESOURCE; CRITICAL ENERGY RESOURCE FACILITY DEFINED.—The terms
"critical energy resource" and "critical energy resource facility" have the meanings given such terms
in section 3025(b) of the Solid Waste Disposal Act
(as added by this section).

20 (b) Solid Waste Disposal Act.—

(1) HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT.—The
Solid Waste Disposal Act (42 U.S.C. 6901 et seq.)
is amended by inserting after section 3024 the following:

1 "SEC. 3025. WAIVERS FOR CRITICAL ENERGY RESOURCE2FACILITIES.

3 "(a) DETERMINATION.—If the Administrator, in con-4 sultation with the Secretary of Energy, determines that 5 processing or refining a critical energy resource at a crit-6 ical energy resource facility is important to the national 7 security or energy security of the United States, then the 8 Administrator may, with respect to the critical energy re-9 source facility, waive application of—

10 "(1) any standard established under section
11 3002, 3003, or 3004;

12 "(2) the permit requirement under section13 3005; or

14 "(3) any other requirement of this title, as the15 Administrator determines appropriate.

16 "(b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

17 "(1) CRITICAL ENERGY RESOURCE.—The term
18 'critical energy resource' means any energy resource
19 that, as determined by the Secretary of Energy—

20 "(A) is essential to the energy sector and
21 energy systems of the United States; and
22 "(B) the supply chain of which is vulner-

able to disruption.

24 "(2) CRITICAL ENERGY RESOURCE FACILITY.—
25 The term 'critical energy resource facility' means a
