

Members of the Committee: thank you for the opportunity to address you this afternoon.

I have three bills that are under your sole jurisdiction:

HR 2636: would amend the Public Health Service Act to include neuropathy in the list of conditions covered by the World Trade Center Health Program.

This constituent-driven legislation simply adds neuropathy to the illnesses covered from the events on 9-11. To have this added in regular order, through the CDC, is extremely bureaucratic and we don't have time to wait on them. Patients who claim a neuropathy-related illness would still go through the same process of having a doctor verify the condition and that the illness is in fact related to their proximity to ground zero in New York City.

H.R.2631 - MINAJ Act of 2023: would prohibit the Federal Government from imposing any mandate requiring an individual to receive a vaccine that has not been authorized for marketing for at least 10 years.

This bill affirms my commitment to protect medical freedom in NY-3 and across our great nation. If enacted, this legislation ensures government transparency and provides for accountability if another public health emergency occurs.

H.R.2635 - The Big-Tech Accountability Act of 2023: would amend section 230 of the Communications Act of 1934 to limit liability protection provided by such section for providers of social media service.

For over a decade, Conservatives and Republicans have been unduly targeted by Big-Tech and de-platformed or censored with no legal protections or action from Congress, until now. This bill allows for accountability if a citizen of the US is de-platformed or censored, while upholding the rights of private companies.

I highly suggest consideration of these important bills and advocate for their advancement in this committee. I thank you all for your time.
